OUR SOLUTIONS: A WORLD BETTER FED WITHOUT FACTORY FARMING

Factory farming is the single biggest cause of animal cruelty on the planet and a key driver in the climate, nature and health catastrophes facing humanity.

HAPPIER, HEALTHIER FARM ANIMALS:

If we get rid of cruel factory farms and restore farm animals to the land in mixed rotational farms, there are huge benefits to be had.

Free-ranging animals can express their natural behaviours – running, flapping, grazing – making for happier animals with better immunity, cutting down on the need for veterinary antibiotics and reducing the risk of disease.

BREATHE LIFE INTO OUR LANDSCAPES:

By returning to rotational farms and naturally-reared animals, we can bring a cascade of positive benefits for the environment too.

When free range animals can wander fields and pasture, they help to regenerate soils. They re-engage the age-old nitrogen cycle where sunlight pushes up plants, eaten by animals whose droppings return nourishment to the soil.

DELIVER ABUNDANT FOOD:

If we cut by half the amount of cereals and soya fed to farm animals, it would free up enough food for an extra 2 billion people. This would swell the world's food basket to feed the 9 billion people anticipated by 2050 without the need for a hectare more of farmland.

PIONEERING A FUTURE WITHOUT FACTORY FARMING

DRIVING CHANGE THROUGH ADVOCACY AND OBJECTIVES

We employ a multifaceted approach, combining advocacy, research, and public engagement to achieve its goals. We are determined to raise animal welfare standards, promote regenerative farming practices, and shift societal attitudes towards more sustainable food production.

- Securing a global agreement on regenerative farming.

STARTING YOUR APPLICATION

Well, you've read a little bit about us - now it's over to you!

Excited about the idea of joining Compassion in World Farming? Wonderful! Let's get you started. Just complete our online application form, where you can upload your CV and a warm, informative cover letter that shows us how your skills and experience align with the job description's Person Specification.

Keep in mind, we might kick off interviews at any time, so don't delay! Your application is our chance to get to know you better, so we can't wait to learn more about you.

Key Information to Include:

Make sure the job title and reference is clearly stated at the beginning of your form, so we know which job you're applying for and if you know anyone at the organisation.

You must sign off your form to confirm that the information you have given is correct. If you don't have an electronic signature, please type your name instead.

Tailor your cover letter: Your cover letter is of particular importance to us. It allows you to personalise your application and express your enthusiasm for the role.

Make sure you include paid work, unpaid work and any work experience in your employment history. Start with your current employment, or if you are currently unemployed, your most recent employment. If there are any gaps in your employment, please tell us why.

At least one of your referees should be your current employer. If you are not currently employed, simply provide your most recent employer. If you don't have any employment history, think about one professional and one personal referee who would best describe your suitability for the role. Please note, we only take up references once a job offer has been made, and accepted.

Organisational Research: Research us! Understanding a company's history, mission, products, industry position, culture, and recent news is vital for job applications. Use this knowledge to tailor your application and excel in interviews.



As part of our application process, we ask that candidates submit both a completed Application Form, cover Letter and an up-to-date CV.

When you apply for a role with Compassion in World Farming, we will always respond to your application either with a phone call or via email.

FINE-TUNE YOUR APPLICATION

Refining your writing style will improve the quality of your application. As employers we are looking for confident applicants who can convince us of their capabilities - demonstrate your suitability by giving short, to the point and positive answers.

O 2 ALIGNING YOUR SKILLS TO THE JOB DESCRIPTION

Please take a note of the essential criteria as detailed in the job description as these are the things that you must have in order to do the job. Desirable criteria are qualities we believe would be an advantage for you to have. But don't panic if you don't have them, dependent on the role these are areas we would look to develop within the role.

BE YOURSELF

As we mentioned earlier, our values are a really important part of how we recruit. We're looking to find new staff who have values aligned to our own - let your personality shine through in your application form and tell us how our values fit in your life!

We know how much time and effort goes into an application and we really appreciate the time you've taken to apply for a job with us. Due to the volume of applications we receive, we're unable to inform and provide feedback to unsuccessful candidates at the shortlisting stage. If you haven't heard from us by the interview date, unfortunately you won't have been shortlisted for the role.
